E. Principal's Report / Faculty Senate – A. Solorzano My report would include that our campus beautification program has made a positive impact within our school community. The Maintenance and Operations staff has also improved its procedures for completing work orders and improvements have been happening throughout the campus. The principal and head custodian will conduct monthly morning walks around campus to identify areas of concern that need to be addressed. Work orders need to go through Jo's office. The custodian crew has also hired another .5 person to deal with smaller items that need attention inside the classrooms and around campus. We are moving in the right direction.

We are looking to pilot a parent patrol. Parents will team up with our campus supervisors and walk around campus and routinely monitor the restrooms for vaping and vandalism. Lately, we have seen no destructive vandalism in our restrooms as our rotation of supervision has been adjusted. Our vaping sensors will be installed by December.

We are trying to launch a peer tutoring program where 11th and 12th grade students can get paid to help tutor our students. Interested students should apply in the career center.

	The Ed Foundation is conducting a learning walk and visiting classrooms this Friday. They will also have a chance to meet with a student panel to hear from student voices about their experiences in Sonoma Valley. The learning walk will conclude with sandwiches provided by our student culinary class with a debrief of their experiences from the walk. Possible power outage tomorrow and Thursday. SVHS will remain open if it has power. Questions for A. Solorzano: - possible concerns about Parent Patrol, wondering if other schools do this - has this been vetted by DO and staff? - this may have come up during Chat with a Principal - concerned parents may have volunteered to help - questions about fingerprinting parents that are on campus? - not sure about what union issues may come up with volunteers vs. classified staff working during break, lunch passing, etc. - vaping sensors coming in Decemberdo they make a noise? - positive that vandalism has decreased
