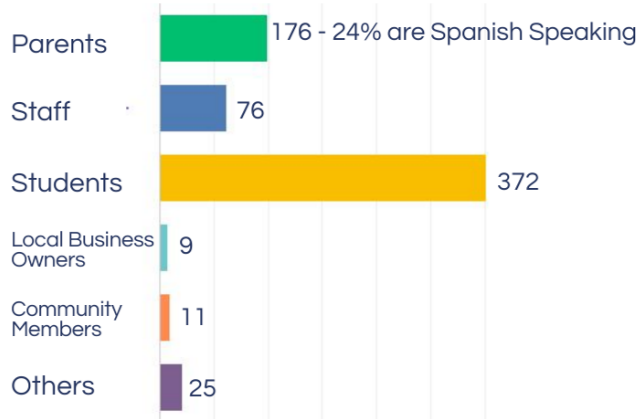


What is a Strategic Plan?

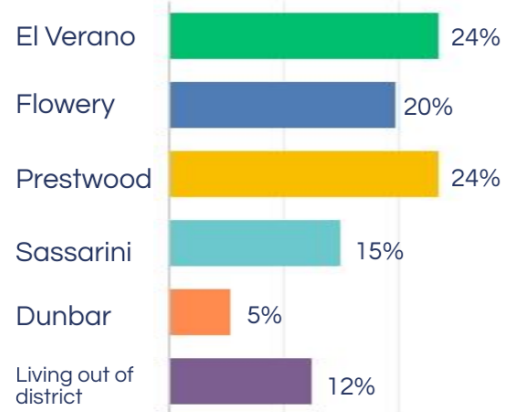
A strategic plan is an in-depth conversation with stakeholders about what matters to our school district as we all commit to student success. This work allows us to form a strong collective team committed to our students.
